



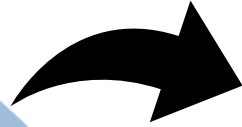
A Christmas Weekend in Copenhagen

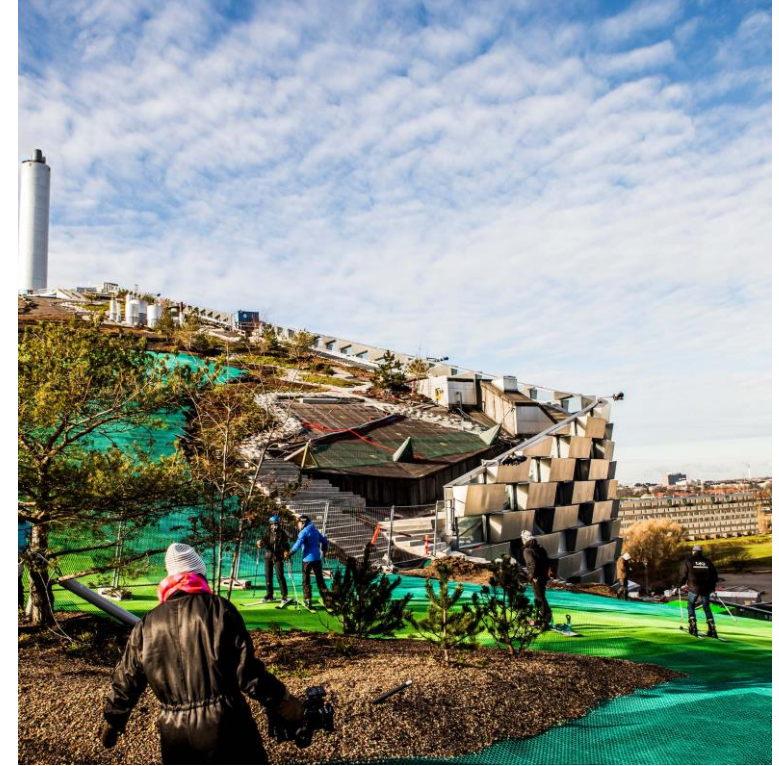

CopenHill



CopenHill is built on top of a waste-to-energy plant, which creates energy by burning waste. This building turned ski-slope offers a number of outdoor activities in the middle of Copenhagen. It is a place to be active together on skis, in running shoes, hiking boots or climbing shoes. CopenHill is a unique opportunity to do activities at a level and at a height that has not been possible in Copenhagen before. Here you also find a recreational area with a café, a restaurant, music and a classic “after ski” atmosphere. All with the absolute best views of Copenhagen.

Ice Sculpting

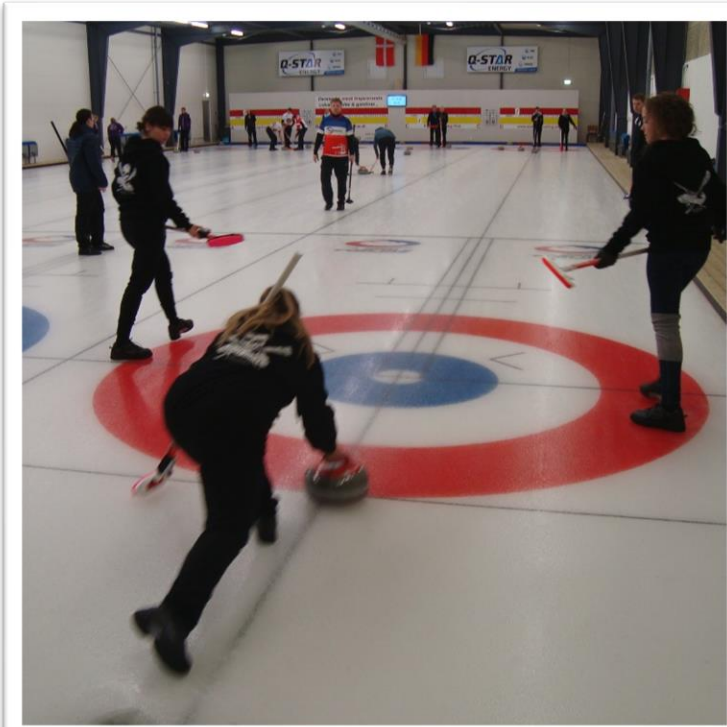


Denmark's only professional full-time ice carver, Morten Mikkelsen, will teach your team the art of ice carving. Ice has grain just like wood, but it is very fragile and of course perishable at normal room temperatures. Carving ice is a complicated process but great fun and a real test of teamwork and skill.

Morten will outline the procedures that will take place throughout the workshop. He will demonstrate carving techniques to reveal how it should be done and afterwards the group will be divided into teams of about 5 to make a common project. It is also possible to make individual sculptures instead of working as a team.

BDP Comment: A perfect winter activity and a unique way to show your creative side.

Curling



Capacity: 10 pax per lane

Curling is played on ice with heavy granite stones. The goal is to have a stone of your team closest to the center of the house, called the 'tee'. Curling has its name from the spin or "curl" when the player releases the stone. This game is fun for everybody and to try it doesn't require any special skills.

BDP Comment: A fun and engaging activity for all ages.

Christmas Hygge



Spend the afternoon creating traditional Danish Christmas ornaments to hang on the Christmas tree. All while enjoying delicious and warm Danish gløgg & æbleskiver. Later in the evening, guests will bring their handmade christmas ornaments to the dinner venue to hang them on the Christmas tree. The dinner venue will be specially decorated for the festive occasion. The fireplace will be lit and Danish hygge will continue into the dinner.

Hygge means creating a warm atmosphere and enjoying the good things in life with good people. Perhaps hygge explains why the Danes are some of the happiest people in the world.

Æbleskiver are round Danish pancakes cooked on a stove with a light and fluffy texture, eaten during the festive time of the year. They are usually paired together with jam and sugar on the side, and of course a warm glass of gløgg.

Gløgg is spiced wine, usually served with a stick of cinnamon, raisins and chopped almonds on a cold winter's day. Danes enjoy their æbleskiver and gløgg at Christmas time around good company and a hot log fire.

CSR Activity - Christmas Wishing Tree Shopping tour



The purpose with the Christmas Shopping is to buy presents for children in needy families and at the same time get to explore the city with a local. The guests will be divided in small groups, and each group will "pluck" a wish from a child. With the help of a local, they will go shopping in the city center and in the Christmas markets. During dinner time, all presents are given to Rotary Denmark, who will distribute the presents to the children on the 24th of December.

Canal Tour



Duration: 1 hour

This leisurely cruise takes you through the canals of Christianshavn with its picturesque old buildings and Our Saviour's Church with its green and gold steeple, The Black Diamond - the new wing of the Royal Library, and other landmarks before ending the cruise at Refshaleøen to have lunch at Refsen Street Food.

BDP comment: Relaxing way to sightsee from the water.

Baking Activity: Danish Christmas Cookies



The Danes are known for having the most delicious baked goods, and there is nothing sweeter than the smell of homemade Danish Christmas cookies. In this activity, the group will learn how to bake traditional Danish cookies which are served only one time a year over the Christmas holiday season. The class will take place with the help of professional baking instructors. Be greeted with a welcome drink upon arrival and throughout the class.

BDP Comment: Experience why baking homemade goods is essential to the Danish concept of hygge.

Taste of Christmas Walk



Experience the Danish Christmas atmosphere throughout the city which usually consists of lots of lights, garlands, hearts, elves, and Christmas markets. This special interest tour is an introduction to both Copenhagen and to the gastronomic world of Danish products and specialties. A tour with experiences for both eyes and tongue.

Visit the food market "Torvehallerne" where you will see and taste some Danish specialties. Cream puffs (flødebolle), liquorice, mini open-faced sandwiches (smørrebrød), Danish snaps (liquor), chocolate, Danish beer etc. Stop by one of the many charming Christmas markets where you can buy handmade products.

This is the ideal way to get a taste of Denmark, while learning about the products that are special to the country.
